Suboptimal rates of vaccination were found for short-term residents and nursing homes located in metropolitan areas.

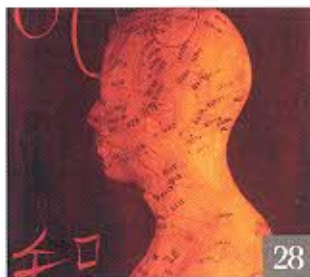
