Although most nursing staff found reminiscence with residents to be an enjoyable and valuable activity, less than half reported engaging in these activities frequently in their professional or personal lives.

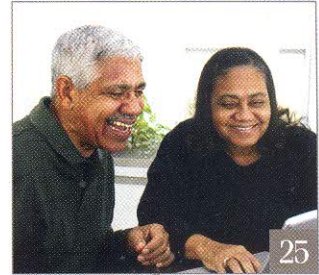
