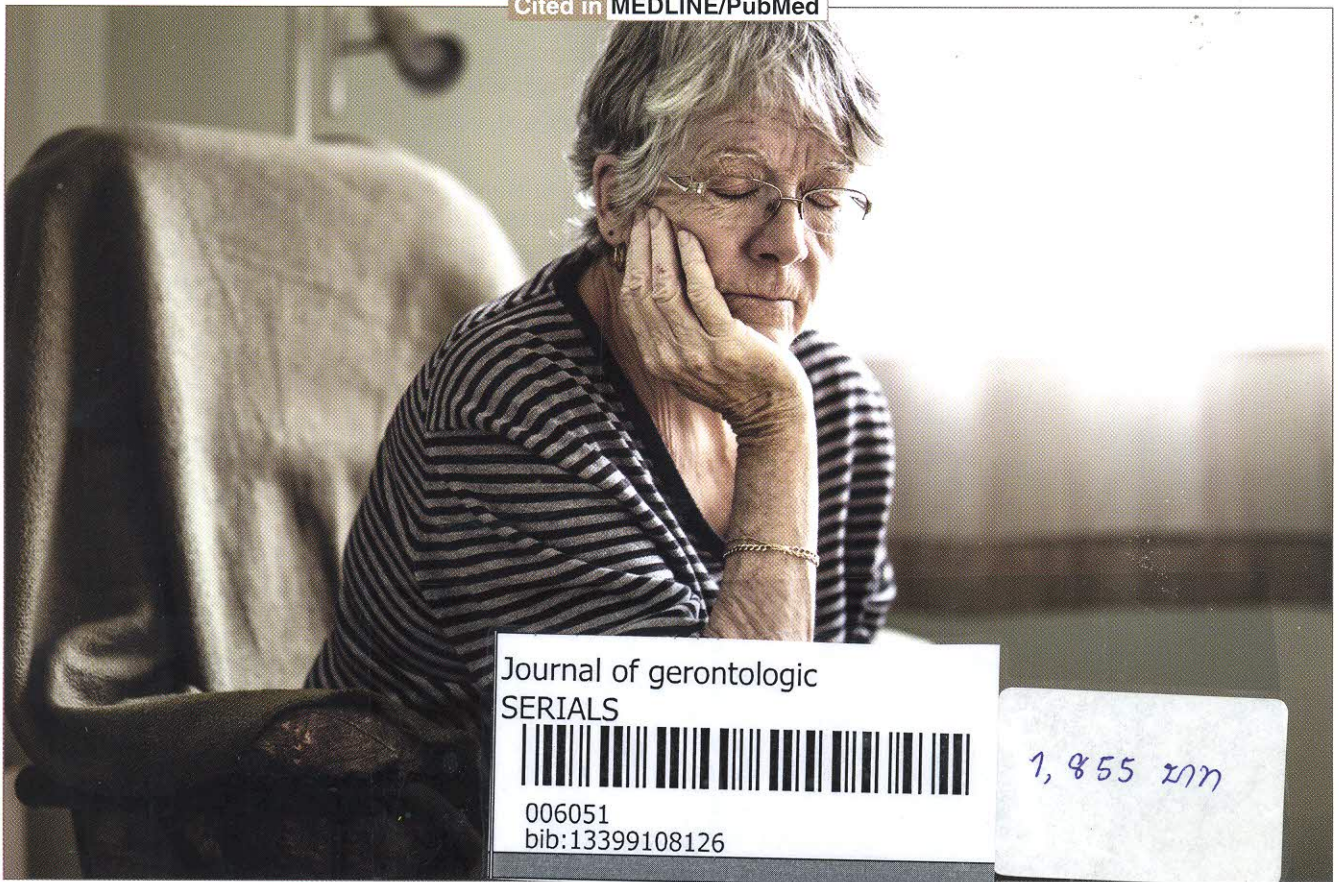

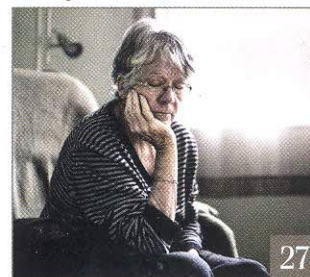

Two symptom clusters were found to affect health promotion and quality of life in older adults with multiple sclerosis: physical/psychological/cognitive symptoms and pain symptoms. These clusters, along with social support, should be considered when providing care and interventions for this population.
