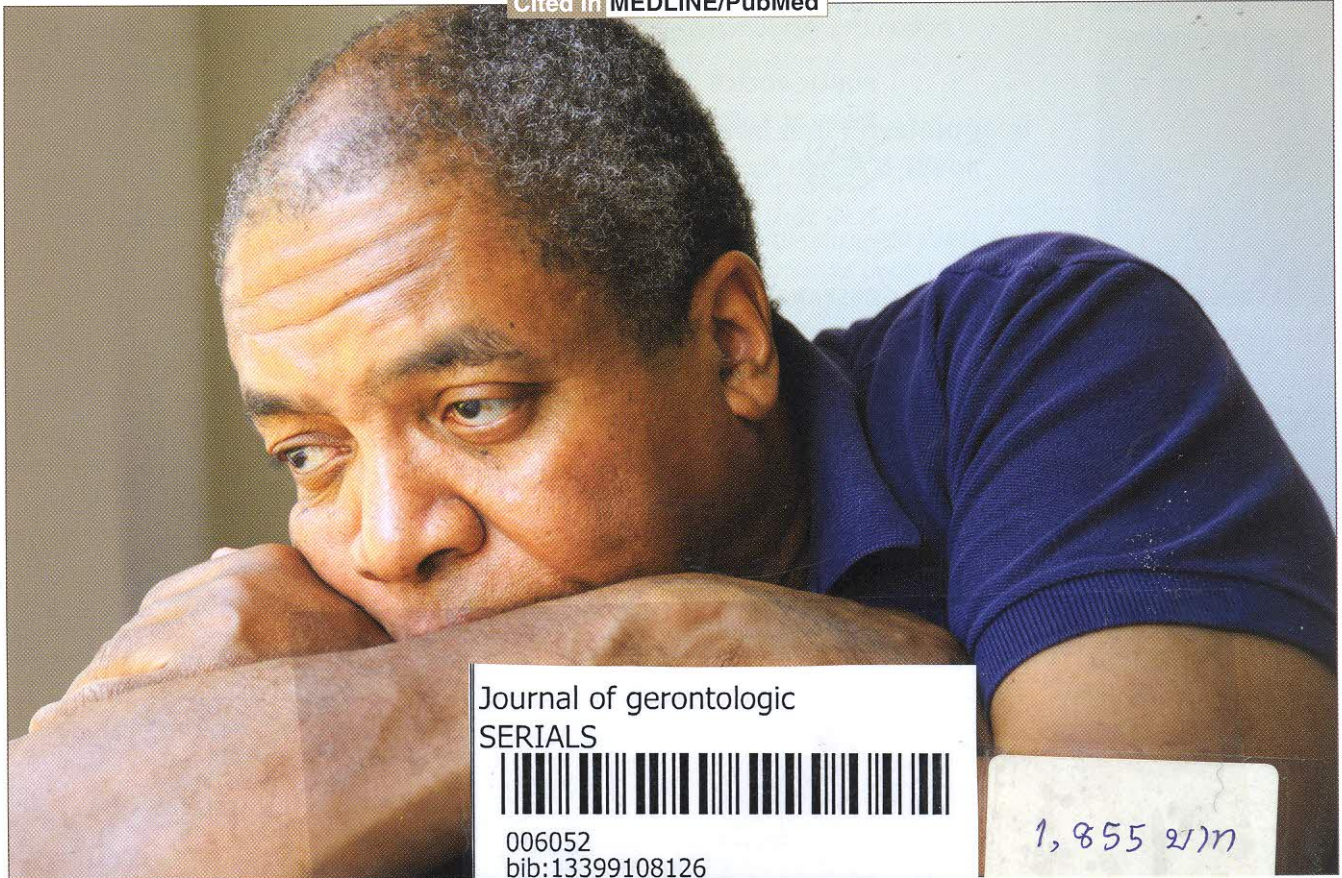

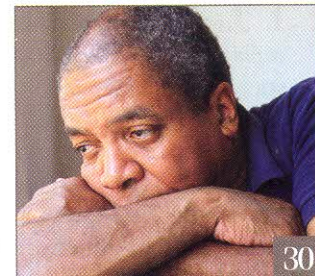

30 Effects of Uncertainty on Perceived and Physiological Stress in Caregivers of Stroke Survivors: A 6-Week Longitudinal Study

Uncertainty was longitudinally associated with perceived stress, but not overall physiological stress; therefore, recognition of uncertainty early in the caregiving period may be useful in identifying at-risk caregivers in need of additional support.
